Featured</b> Image Make Visual Impact and Entice Readers	<ul> <li>The Point: Offer a beautiful, shareable, pertinent image that will give a clear context to your post and match the brand of your site.</li> <li>There are lots of places to find great images. Pick one!</li> <li>Stock Photo Product Photo Info-graphic Quote/Headline</li> <li>Freeze frame from Video Other:</li> </ul>

Headline</li> <li>State your Promise</li> <li>Use curiosity provoking words</li> <li>State the benefit</li> <li>Ask a question</li> <li>How to</li> <li>News Headline</li> <li>Command action</li> <li>Use numbers</li> </ul>	The Point: Get your reader to open your post with a promise of value.         - Brainstorm 4 or 5 headlines to choose from when you're ready to Publish.

Intro/</b></li> <li><b>Opening</b></li> <li>Give a context to your Promise</li> <li>Tell a short story</li> <li>Explain the benefit</li> <li>Ask a question</li> <li>Share a quote</li> <li>State a problem</li> <li>Quote a surprising statistic</li> <li>Start with a controversial statement</li> </ul>	The Point: Confirm that you are going to give them what you promised, with some YOU (ahempersonality) added in. <ul> <li>This'll hook your readers and get 'em to commit to reading your post.</li> <li>If you're concerned with SEO and keywords - this is prime real estate.</li> </ul>

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<ul> <li><b>4.Body</b></li> <li><b>Fulfill your Promise</b></li> <li>You should plan out any and all kinds of blog posts, so that you know your awesome expertise is all included and clear. You can include any content here:</li> <li>Research Article</li> <li>Opinion piece</li> <li>List</li> <li>Video</li> <li>Pictures</li> <li>Narrative</li> <li>Interview</li> <li>How-to</li> <li>Review</li> <li>Coming Soon Announcement</li> <li>Guest content</li> <li>Anything your heart desires</li> </ul>	Figure out how you will fulfill the promise and plan it out! <ul> <li>Actually plan it, punkin! Even if it's "only a picture post", because it's never only anything. If you're putting it out there, you have to be sure that it's put together right.</li> <li>Start by reminding yourself of your promise. Then, break it into pieces or Points. Three pieces is pretty neat, but it could have 4 or 5.</li> <li>Make note of any details you want to make sure you include with each Point, and the source, if you need to give credit or find something.</li> <li>Point 1:</li></ul>
<b>5. Conclusion</b> Remind them that you are a Rockin' Promise keeping machine.	<ul> <li>The Point: It's dessert, baby. This is simply a reminder that you did what you promised you would. It's the ribbons you tie up your present with.</li> <li>Close it neatly, reminding your readers that you gave 'em what you promised.</li> <li>Think of a cute way to "tie it up" that will feel satisfying and clearly state what you gave your reader.</li> <li>Make it light and quick.</li> </ul>
<b>6. Call to</b> <b>Action</b> So what now?	<ul> <li>Tell them how to get involved.</li> <li>Always ask your readers to interact with the post, by email or comment, and remind them to share and like it on social media.</li> <li>ALSO - make sure that you tell your readers how to use the information you gave them: do you want them to think about it when they are shopping for something? Use it while making a decision? Start making a change in their life with it? Tell them.</li> <li>And ask them to come back next week, and sign up for your email reminder, so they don't miss anything (OPT-IN for the WIN)!</li> </ul>
